My Cockatiel is Eating Too Much

Basic Symptoms:

There are many reasons why your cockatiel might be eating more than usual, but most of the reasons are nothing really to worry about it.

If your cockatiel is very active, is laying eggs or is feeding young chicks, your tiel of course will eat more. Also, a low temperature in the environment will make a cockatiel eat more.

If your cockatiel is eating a lot but is lethargic or you don't see a visual gain weight it could be a sign of illness. Check your cockatiel droppings to see if they are watery. Parasites can also make your tiel eat more than usual.

Did you know that a cockatiel can also suffer from diabetes? This could also explain why your bird might eat a lot but still acts lethargic. In cockatiels with diabetes, the problem evolves from the pancreas being damaged by infection or other secondary issues.

If you suspect that your cockatiel might have a serious illness associated with eating please do see an avian vet.

As always the information offered here is to provide guidance and is not intended to be a substitute for the good advice provided by your own avian vet. When in doubt always consult your own veterinarian.

How much should a cockatiel eat a day?

When you provide fresh food, which you should do once or twice daily, they will cut down on the amount of pellets or seeds that they eat. In general, cockatiels will eat approximately 15 grams of food per day. The key to a healthy cockatiel is a varied diet, with many types of nutrients and vitamins.

How often should you feed a baby cockatiel?

The second week of life, cockatiel chicks need to be fed every four hours. The babies can go approximately eight hours overnight without being fed. At this stage, the cockatiels will begin begging loudly for food, making it easy to overfeed them. Four to six milliliters should be enough to fill the crop at this age.

Note: If the sex of the cockatiel is unknown and there is a cock class for that mutation (i.e. classes 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13 and 14), then the bird must be put in the cock class, either (1, 6, 8, or 13)

My Cockatiel is Too Skinny

Basic Symptoms:

If you feel your cockatiel is too skinny but otherwise is alert, happy and healthy, you might want to look into a couple of possible causes.

Many new cockatiel owners do not realized that they need to refresh and clean their bird's seeds everyday. Cockatiels will not eat the shell of the seeds. Make sure your cockatiel always have new and complete seeds everyday.

Cockatiels love millet and that is OK, but millet should only be use as a treat and not as a main source of a cockatiel's diet. Millet to cockatiels is like popcorn to humans.

If your cockatiel is very active, it might not be receiving enough calories in its diet. The best cockatiel diet is variety, do check our nutritional section for ideas about your tiel eating right. If you feel that your cockatiel do have a proper diet and is eating but still is too skinny, you might want to see an avian vet, as it might be an underlying reason for certain illnesses like diabetes or parasites.

As always the information offered here is to provide guidance and is not intended to be a substitute for the good advice provided by your own avian vet. When in doubt always consult your own veterinarian.

What should a cockatiel weight?

A healthy adult cockatiel can weigh from 72 – 170 grams. Birds with an inbred history, as well as certain color mutations, are much more likely to be on the small side.

How to help your cockatiel gain weight

If you have ruled out any underlying diseases on your cockatiel but your bird is still too skinny, you can try a temporary diet that will complement your bird's current feeding habits.

Cockatiels are notoriously picky eaters, and many tend to pick through their food bowls and eat only their favorite items, even when they are served a mix of great variety.

Several items that you can add to your cockatiel's feeding bowl that are packed with lots of calories and nutrition are peanuts, sunflower seeds and millet spray. It's very important that you don't overdo it, as too much of anything is also not good for your bird.

It's highly advisable that you get yourself a bird scale, there are relatively inexpensive and they do go a long way as it will help you determine if your bird is in good shape, weight wise. Any time you notice a fluctuation from your bird's normal weight amounting to an ounce or more in either direction, your best bet is to check with your avian vet to make sure that your bird's diet is on the right track.

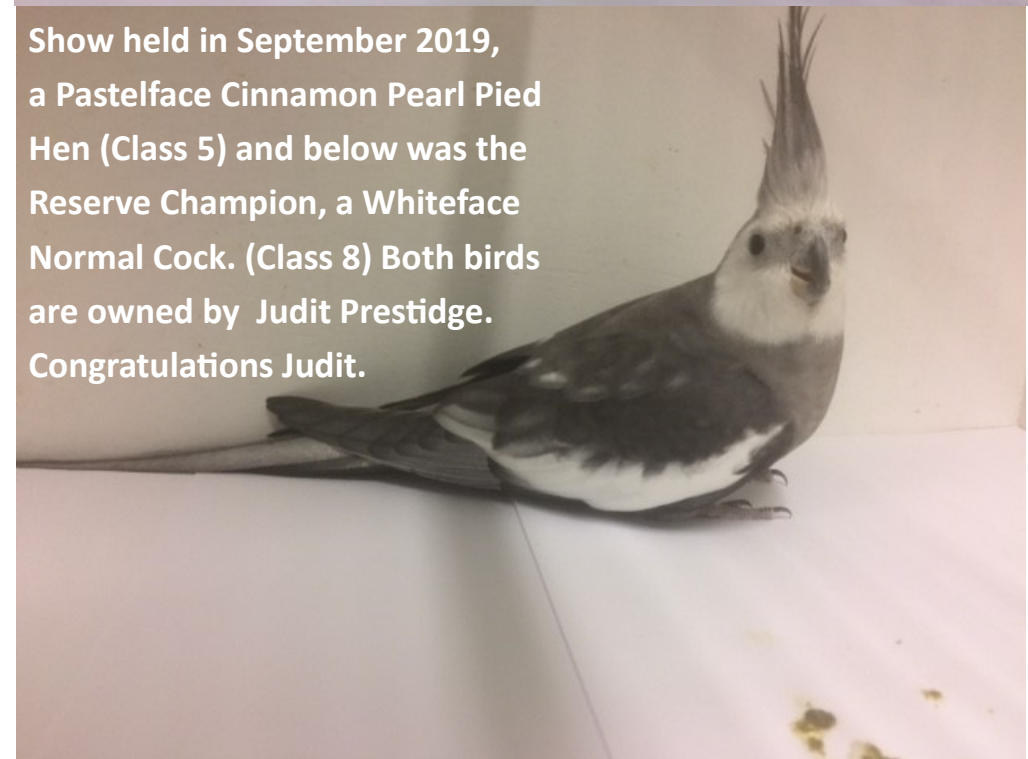

AUSTRALIAN BIRDS in BACKYARDS

Eclectus Parrot

What does it look like? Description:

The Eclectus Parrot is a large parrot with marked sexual dimorphism (the male and female are different). The male is emerald green, with bend of wing blue, primaries deep blue, underwing coverts and sides of belly rich scarlet. It has a short square tail with central tail feathers green tipped with blue; outer tail feathers are blue tipped with white. The underside of the tail is dusky tipped yellow. The eye is orange. The upper mandible of its bill is coral pink, but the lower mandible is black. Feet and toes are mid grey. The female's plumage is vivid red, darker and duller on back and wings. It has a blue collar across the mantle and the bend of the wing and underwing coverts are bright blue, with a broad violet-blue band across the belly. The tail is red tipped with orange. Around the pale yellow eye is a blue ring. The bill is black. The feet and toes are the same as for the male. In flight for both sexes the blue-wing linings and orange tail are conspicuous. Immatures resemble adults. In both sexes the bill is dark brown-grey becoming dusky yellow towards tip. The Eclectus Parrot is also called the Red-sided Parrot and Rocky River Parrot. **(PIC: Female Left– Male Right)**



Similar Species:

The male is unmistakable. The female is somewhat similar to the male King Parrot.

Where does it live? Distribution:

The Eclectus Parrot is found on Eastern Cape York Peninsula, from Pascoe River south to Massey Creek and inland to McIlwraith Range and is locally common. Also widely distributed from Solomon Islands west through New Guinea to Moluccas

Feeding:

The Eclectus Parrot feeds in trees on berries and other fruit, nuts, seeds and blossoms. In the early morning pairs and small parties leave the roosting trees and move out into surrounding forest to feed.

Breeding:

Eclectus Parrot nests in a big hole 50cm to 6m deep in the trunk of a tall tree at the edge of or in a clearing in forest. The eggs are laid on a lining of chips and decayed wood dust. Incubation is by the female over about 26 days. Both parents care for the chicks and seem to be helped in the task. Reports state that up to eight birds of both sexes appear to attend the nests. The young leave the nest 11-12 weeks after hatching
